Scripture Memory: Habakkuk 1:1

“The burden of Habakkuk the prophet did see.”

In Habakkuk 2:4, what message is found for the child of God? Discussion: What do you think this means and why is this important?

God tells us this great truth, that the just shall live by faith.

Jeremiah 36:1-24 gives us insight into Habakkuk’s day. What was the attitude toward God’s Word? Why is this attitude so destructive?

Though some listened to the Word of God and feared, yet the King, Jehoiakim, burned it in the fire.

Habakkuk 1:1 tells us that Habakkuk had a burden. What does it mean to have a burden? Why do you think he was burdened? What should burden us today?

A burden is a load of weight. In this sense Habakkuk saw the people despise God and what he saw was his burden.

What truth do we learn from Hebrews 13:8? Why is this a comfort to us?

We learn that the Lord Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever.

What does Habakkuk, in his burden, pray to God for? Why, in our day, must we pray similarly?

Habakkuk prays for a revival of His work, a renewal of knowledge of truth, and mercy in the midst of wrath.

What made Habakkuk rejoice despite the dark day in which he lived in Habakkuk 3:17, 18? Why must we emulate this same thing in our lives?

Though many things were wrong and going to get worse, Habakkuk rejoiced in his salvation.

According to Luke 10:20, what should the disciples not rejoice in and what were they to rejoice in? Why do you think this is true and how is this relevant for us today?

The Lord told the disciples not to rejoice in the subjection of spirits but to rejoice in that their names are written in heaven.
