God Is Light

Scripture Memory: I John 1:5

“This then is the message which we have heard of him, and declare unto you, that God is light, and in him is no darkness at all.”

In I John 1:5, what is the message that John heard and then declared? Discussion: What makes this message so important for both the unsaved and the saved?

John declared that, “God is light, and in him is no darkness at all.” This is important for salvation and for our continued fellowship with the Lord.

Read Revelation 21:9-23. Who is the light in the city of God? What would that city be like without this light?

In this marvelous city, the Lord Jesus Christ is the light.

In John 1:1-14, what do we learn about the true light? Why should we be willing for the light of the Lord Jesus Christ to shine upon us?

1. Jesus is the Light of men
2. Jesus shined in the darkness of the world but the world did not acknowledge Him
3. Jesus does shine upon every person who is born in the world

Read II Corinthians 4:4-6. What does the light of the Lord Jesus do for people? Why do people refuse to come to the light of the Lord?

The light shines upon those who believe and shine in our hearts so that we may have knowledge of the God in the face of Jesus.

According to John 8:12, what must we do in order to have the light of the Lord? Why do some Christians decide not to follow the Lord?

We must follow the Lord Jesus in order to have His light upon us.

According to I John 1:6-7, what must we do in order to have fellowship with the Lord? What is the attraction of darkness?

In order to have fellowship with the Lord we must walk in the light and not in darkness.

In I John 1:7, 9, what does God teach us about his cleansing and forgiveness? Discussion: Why would we not walk in the light by confessing our sin?

If we walk in the light of the Lord Jesus, He will cleanse us from sin. If we confess our sins unto Him, He will cleanse us and forgive us.

Read Amos 3:3. What keeps two people from walking together? Why must we agree with God and not the other way around?

Walking together in fellowship and partnership requires agreement.
