Scripture Memory: Habakkuk 1:12

“Art thou not from everlasting, O Lord my God, mine Holy One? We shall not die. O Lord, thou hast ordained them for judgment; and. O mighty God, thou hast established them for correction.”

List the names of God found in Habakkuk 1:12? Discussion: Why does Habakkuk use these names and why are they important for us?

What do we learn about God in Malachi 3:6? Discussion: How does this strengthen our faith?

In Genesis 1:1, what is being learned, God’s beginning or creation’s beginning? Discussion: Why is it important that we understand that God has no beginning?

God is not teaching us about His beginning but about how He created all things in the beginning.

What attribute of God is emphasized in Psalm 90:1, 2? Discussion: Why is this truth so important for our faith?

God is everlasting and we can trust in this truth and he will always be our dwelling place.

What are some of the contrasts between God and man in Job 14:1? What are some others and why is it important that we know these?
